# Motives for Evangelism

Why do you do what you do? Our motives are very important and should not be overlooked. In *The Evangelism Handbook*, Alvin Reid says, "Surely there should be a connection between our motive and our method. Why share Christ? Too much emphasis on evangelism has to do with the "how to." Christianity is a movement. The best way to know your movement is in trouble is when all you do is create how-to manuals! For people to have a lasting commitment to something as personally challenging as evangelism, we need a clear understanding of "why" before proceeding to the "how."

First, our motive should start with God. Mark Liederbach wrote, "The supreme motivation for evangelism, then, finds its genesis in who evangelism is about, and all other motivations find deep and rich grounding and proper expression from that point alone." Why would we not want to share who He is with everyone just because of who He is? Christianity is not just a faith in faith. Faith has no value unless its object is legitimate, and our God is the only one who is

legitimate. Faith is not about feeling but fact. Faith is not about what is unknown but what is unseen (Hebrews 11:1).

It is not just about the task of evangelizing. We are not created to just be task-oriented people but to first be principle oriented. Unfortunately, you sometimes hear the

remark, "I don't care about theology; I only care if it works." Everything we do is theological! The first question should never be, "Does it work, but rather, "Is it right? The right thing to do is realize that God desires all to worship Him, and because of that truth, we desire for as many others as possible to join us in that worship. We share Christ because of who He is, and there is none other like Him. We are first called to love Him with all our heart, soul, and mind.

Second, followers of Christ are the only ones who have the real answers to why humanity is broken and how it can be fixed.

# **Motives**

Mankind has figured out many things through reasoning and science, but no one has ever figured out how to fix their relationship with God. Salvation is His plan on His terms. What a child of God has to offer to the world, no one else has to offer. We need to know what we believe and why we believe it, because Christianity is being asked the hard questions. Theology is important because we must make sure our language is precise, clear, and biblical. Do you know how to show someone how to be born again? If you don't, learn!

Third, our motivation for evangelism is a concern for those who are lost. The New Testament term "lost" is not a derogatory one. It actually denotes how valuable "lost" people are to God and the effort He gives, and we should give to find them. Just check out Luke 15! What is it about us that has so little concern for our neighbors and acquaintances who do not know Christ? It appears that many find it far easier to go on a mission trip and witness there than to witness to the people they know. Personal evangelism is not only theologically sound but also the most effective way to reach "lost" people. Evangelism is important because it is important to God.

Quoting from Alvin Reid's book, again he says, "The Western church has too often seen Christianity as a means to personal fulfillment, a way to find your best life now. Many believers demonstrate a lack of passion for the gospel stemming from a consumer ethic. After all, sharing Christ will bring

rejection. The gospel, no matter how winsomely you share it, will be a stumbling block to some and scandalous to others (see 1 Corinthians 1:23). So if you or I are driven by a Christianity that is fundamentally about our happiness, we will hardly be motivated to be rejected, which will happen if we share Christ faithfully."

Why should we be motivated to evangelize? Francis Schaeffer said it well when asked about how to answer all the critics, skeptics, doubters, and false teachers, We don't do it to win, we do it because our risen Savior commanded us!" Change occurs not by being told what we need to do for God but by hearing the good news about what God has done for us. Gospel change is the Spirit of God using the story of God to make the beauty of God come alive in our hearts. The focus is on believing and not behaving, so we need to share with others what it means to repent and

# **Reports from BMA National Work**

# BMA Seminary 2023 Recap by Philip Attebery, Vice-President/Dean

The Baptist Missionary Association Theological Seminary continues to be blessed as it provides accredited theological education to those interested in developing skills needed for leadership roles within varied Christian ministry contexts. In 2023, BMA Seminary completed its 66th year of operation.

Students from more than 15 of the United States and 18 foreign countries took courses during the 2023 academic year. Nineteen students graduated in May 2023 with either an Associate of Divinity, Bachelor of Arts in Religion, Master of Arts (Religion), Master of Arts (Pastoral Theology), Master of Arts in Church Ministries, or Master of Divinity degree. Graduates included students from Arkansas, Illinois, Mississippi, Oklahoma,

Tennessee, and Texas. Graduates also came from Cape Verde, China, the Philippines, and South Korea.

Several new projects began in 2023. First, Leadership Jacksonville sponsored and completed a project to renovate the seminary's playground. Second, the Seminary introduced two programs of study in disciple making that are especially favorable for laypersons: the Master of Arts in Disciple Making degree and the Certificate in Disciple Making. Third, the seminary began a capital campaign that will continue through 2024 with plans to provide much needed renovation to student housing and the seminary's main parking areas.

Those interested in developing skills and strategy essential for disciple making are encouraged to contact the seminary dean's office for more information on how to enroll in Spring 2024 classes. Those interested in helping

to improve the seminary's campus are encouraged to contact the seminary president's office.

Also, BMA administrators and faculty visited countries in Africa, Central America, and South America to provide advanced religious studies for various Bible institutes. Visits to Africa will continue in 2024 for the purpose of equipping local pastors associated with BMA mission work. Financial support for this ministry is also appreciated.

BMA Seminary provides accredited theological education to qualified individuals by seeking to equip them for Christian service and leadership roles. The seminary supports the educational needs of the Baptist Missionary Association of America and other groups who share a like commitment to the authority of Scripture by offering certificates, associate, bachelor, and masters' degrees.

### 2023 Ministry Report



Dear friends, I want to personally express my gratitude for your faithful prayers and support over the past year. This year has been full of ministry and service to local churches all over the globe. I would like to share an encouraging report with you concerning the ministry work completed in 2023.

## Here is the 2023 ministry report for Baptist Publishing House:

We have printed thousands of Gospel tracts and built a Gospel website. Our tracts present the Gospel message clearly and biblically. They also connect people to our new evangelism website (knowthegospel.net). On this website, the Gospel is more fully explained, new believers can download a Bible study to help them grow, and they can get connected to a BMA church in their area. BMA Global (Missions) will help connect new believers to a BMA churches in their area.

Our new children's curriculum, DiscipleKidz, has been very well received. Churches all across the US and world are using DiscipleKidz to teach their children about the Bible and the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Book 1, which covers the Old Testament, was released this past March. Book 2, which covers the Gospels and Acts, is currently being written, and is scheduled to release in spring 2024. We are excited to see how this new children's curriculum is helping churches minister to children. You can visit <a href="mailto:disciplekidz.com">disciplekidz.com</a> to learn more and download a free sample pack!

We have continued to support missionaries and church planters all over the world. Whether it is sending free curriculum or purchasing a printer and supplies, we stand behind BMA missionaries and church planters as they work to fulfill Christ's Great Commission. We have begun selling DiscipleWay Materials. DiscipleWay is one of the most thorough and effective disciple-making resources available. This study course consists of seven small studies which cover different spiritual disciplines (Bible Study, Prayer, Worship, Giving, Witnessing, Serving, and Leading). This curriculum is perfect for developing new

leaders and helping believers mature in their relationship with the Lord and grow in knowledge of the Bible.

We have provided churches with a verse-by-verse study over the book of Judges, completed our study through the book of Genesis, and began a three-part study on the Gospel of Mark.

We provided Bible study and teaching workshops in Mexico, Arkansas, Texas, Oklahoma, Missouri, and Louisiana.

### Here is what is coming in 2024!

DiscipleKidz Book 2 will be released in the spring. This book will provide 52 Bible lessons on the Gospels and Acts.

We will print Sunday School studies on Mark 5-9, 1 Corinthians 12-14 (about spiritual gifts, Mark 10-16, and begin a study through the book of Exodus (tentative). Reprinting J.E. Cobb's "Brief Studies in Christian Doctrines," Dr. Joe Pendleton's "The Joy of Bible Study," and printing a book about Baptist churches and associations adapted from D.N. Jackson's writings.

in the Philippines, we felt our missionary days were over. But God had a different plan.



The man who made the highest profession of faith in the Bible is mainly remembered as "Doubting Thomas". He was a doubter to be

sure, but he defeated his doubts. His faith won out!

Why is it that most people are so quick to overlook the good things about a man, but recall in vivid, Technicolor detail mistakes?

Shakespeare had

Marc Antony to say "The evil that men do lives after them; the good is often interred with their bones." How we all have made Technicolor mistakes! Let's look at these pictures:

God would say to us, through the experience of Thomas, that doubts can be overcome, that faith, when assailed, can win; that it is possible for the same man who said "I will not believe" (vs. 25) to come to the point of saying "My Lord and my God!"

Thomas – a daring realist – John 11:7-16

Lazarus was critically ill and died. Christ had narrowly escaped mobs who demanded his death by stoning. Now Jesus was to return to Judea and the disciples spoke of fear for his life. Thomas said, "Let us also go!" He showed himself to be an unswerving loyalist. He had made his decision to follow Jesus.

Thomas – absolutely honest – John 14:4-5

We find Jesus giving his friends those wonderful instructions in chapters 13-17. The impulsive, honest voice of Thomas rings out in chapter 14. They did not know the destination, so how could they know the way. If Thomas had not asked the question, we may never have had these clarifying and comforting words of Jesus.

Everything has changed now. The shadow of the cross had ceased to be a shadow. Jesus was dead and in the grave. By that death, the disciples had been scattered. But by the news of the resurrection, they had been regathered.

We do criticize him for being absent from the meeting, but we look carefully and absolutely honest, for Thomas declined to profess a faith he did not have. He was an honest doubter. He was not playing mental gymnastics; he was a serious seeker of the truth. He was more than doubting Thomas, he was Seeking Thomas. This man wanted to know.

We admire Thomas for he was with the believers the next Sunday evening and there he cried out "My Lord and my God!"

Thomas - present with the saints.

He missed the first blessing because he was not with the saints. but received certainty in his own faith because he was present with them the second time. Thomas was alone, he was doubly alone. Nowhere is one more likely to find Christ than in the company of those who love Christ.

# Needing A Change

"God shall hear, and afflict them, even he that abideth of old. Selah. Because they have no changes, therefore they fear not God." (Psalms 55:19)

Our text speaks of people who fear not God because they have not experienced some needed changes. One of those changes is an inward change that comes in conversion. Also, many of God's people are needing a change in their present way of living. All of God's children will experience a change of their body when this

life is over. Consider with me these three needed changes.

When man was created in the image and likeness of God (Genesis 1:26), man found

himself in an high and holy state enjoying the fellowship of God. But because of his sin he fell into a sinful, depraved state, separated from God. But because of God's great love for the world, He fixed a way that man could experience a change that would give him peace with God and everlasting life in Jesus . (John 3:16).

Because of this fall in Adam, man finds himself Spiritually dead (Romans 5:12). He therefore needs the everlasting life that comes when one receives Jesus-- "He that hath the Son hath life; and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life" (1 John 5:12). He also finds himself in Satan's family (I John 3:10). He therefore needs to be born again-- "Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3). He is living in the region of darkness and therefore needs to be moved to the region of light--"For ve were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light:" (Ephesians 5:8) He also is experiencing bondage (Hebrews 2:15). He therefore needs to be set free--"And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." (John 8:32) He is suffering Spiritual blindness, and he needs to be able to see--"To open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me." (Acts 26:18)

All mankind is lost in sin until he experiences a change. And only by receiving Christ as his Savior can this change take place--"Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost;" (Titus 3:5)

Though we experience an inward change when we receive Jesus as our Savior, we continue to live in a depraved, sinful body. Many therefore neglect the things that aid Christians in living right, and therefore backslid. These need to make an outward change. Jeremiah called upon Israel to make this change--"Go and proclaim these words toward the north, and say, Return, thou backsliding Israel, saith the LORD; and I will not cause mine anger to fall upon you: for I am merciful, saith the LORD, and I will not keep anger for ever." (Jeremiah 3:12) Many of

God's people need to hear this call of God and come back to their first love (Revelation 2:4). They need to change.

There is a third change that all of God's children will make one day. It will take place on that wonderful day when Jesus returns to earth for His people. Notice two verses that tells us about it--"Behold, I show you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed." (1 Corinthians 15:52)

After battling with sin and experiencing physical and mental pain all of our earthly life, we should be ready for that wonderful change. Death still has its sting, but a new body like Jesus sounds good-- "Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is." (1 John 3:2)

But there is a great danger here. Some have never invited Jesus into their heart as their Savior. These therefore, will never experience this third change that assures one of eternal peace and happiness.
